Please be advised that the County of San Bernardino, Department of Public Health, Division of Environmental Health Services – Local Enforcement Agency (LEA) received and approved a Registration Permit Application for Rim of the World High School Medium Volume Transfer Facility (MVTF). The LEA is certified by the California Department of Resources Recycling and Recovery (CalRecycle) to enforce state laws and regulations at solid waste sites within the County of San Bernardino, including all active transfer stations.

Description of Project and LEA's Determination

Rim of the World High School Medium Volume Transfer Facility is located at 27380 Highway 18, Lake Arrowhead, CA 92352. On February 03, 2025, the LEA received, from Burrtec Waste Industries, Inc., the official submittal application for a Registration Permit.

Rim of the World High School MVTF is permitted to receive up to 50 tons per day of municipal solid waste (MSW). The facility is open to the public on Saturdays and Sundays from 8:00 AM to

3:00 PM. The loading of materials into trucks and containers may occur up to 6:00 PM. The facility operates on 0.5 acres of the Rim of the World School parking lot. The facility may handle municipal solid waste, green waste and recyclables.

Rim of the World Medium Volume Transfer Facility shall follow all minimum standards applicable to it, as set forth in Title 14, Division 7 of the California Code of Regulations (CCR), including but not limited to the following:

- Title 14, Division 7, Chapter 5 Article 3, (Regulatory Tier Requirements) and
- Title 14, Division 7, Chapter 3 Articles 6.0, 6.1, 6.2, 6.3, and 6.35 (Transfer Processing Facility Regulatory Requirements)
- Monthly recordkeeping reporting of all sections in Article 6.3 Section 17414 to the LEA due within ten (10) days from the following month.

The updated Facility Plan (Dated 2024) included the following updates:

- Reorganization of Table of Contents
- Update to liquid waste control for vehicles
- Update to Personal Health and Safety
- Update to Inclement Weather Control Procedures
- Update for SB1383 sampling requirements

The LEA accepted the application as complete and correct on March 5th, 2025.
